BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF TOYMU

TOYMU, a Tripura word meaning 'never ending', TOYMU, is a local voluntary development organization in Chittagong Hill Tracts. It established in 1994 by some social-minded students in response to the issues of extreme poverty, low literacy rate, social and political conflict, eroding cultural identity, and high incidence of human rights violations among the indigenous peoples in the Chittagong Hill Tracts of Bangladesh. Officially it was registered as a non-government voluntary development organization in the Social Service Department of Bangladesh in 1996 and in the NGO Affairs Bureau in 1998.

Its **vision** is to establish a peaceful society where people of CHT enjoying a life free from poverty, disease and discrimination. And **mission** is to bring sustainable development among people of CHT by reducing poverty, eradicating illiteracy, eliminating discrimination and reducing disease & deformity among the marginalized people of CHT undertaking participatory need-based and rights-based development programs.

Since last two decades, Toymu has been making significant contribution for the development of CHT people in the field of community empowerment, economic development, education (Formal and Nonformal), gender equality & women development, child development, health and nutrition, water & sanitation, forest and environment, agriculture, human rights and good governance.

Toymu has been working with a wide range of **national and international donors** such as Arannyak Foundation, European Commission, UNDP, UNICEF, World Food Program, Asian Development Bank,

MANAGEMENT OF THE ORGANIZATION:

Toymu operates through a General Body (policy makers) and Executive Committee (decision-makers).

General Body consists of 22 members (women -05). The GB at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) makes organizational policies, approves annual budget/ project budget and audit, appoints auditors and elects the

Executive Committee.

Executive Committee consists of 07 members (women-02). The EC members have a stake in the administrative and financial affairs, besides policymaking and strategic management, which ensures financial transparency and accountability of the organization. The EC approves and reviews the projects and annual plan. The Board guides the Executive Director for smooth and proper implementation of

projects. There is also an advisory board to extend their assistance for smooth function of the organization activities.

Executive Director is the head of the organization and exercises authority over all works and activities. The ED maintains necessary liaison with different donors, Govt. Officials, Civil Society and others for development of the organization. The ED is accountable and reportable to the EC.

Financial Management:

Toymu has a Financial Management Policy that governs transparency and accountability in managing program and project funds. It is consistent with the standard accounting rules and principles and compliant with statutory and donor requirements (Stated elsewhere in the document)


Policies and guidelines:

TOYMU has a developed different policies and guidelines which are strictly follows to ensure ethical and effective performance. The written manifest policies and guidelines are; i.The constitution ii.Administrative policy, iii.Human Resource Policy, iv.Gender policy, v.Child Protection Policy vi. Monitoring & Evaluation System:

TOYMU has its M&E section consisting of an M&E officer, Management Consultant and individual project monitoring staffs. The section is responsible for developing and implementation of M&E plans and methodologies to ensure effective and efficient execution of all projects and programs of TOYMU. The M&E staff have long experience, relevant qualification and expertise for monitoring and evaluation. TOYMU follows a Monitoring & Evaluation System that consists of: a) Input/output monitoring, b) Impact monitoring and evaluation, c) External evaluation and specific studies.

GENDER POLICY AND GENDER FOCUSED ACTIVITIES:

Toymu has gender policy and followed strictly in every programmes and organizational decision process.

Major objectives of Gender policy are; (i)To provide guidelines for creating an enabling environment for fostering a process of institutionalization of gender equality. (ii) To be used as a useful document for providing strategic directions in terms of programmatic and organizational planning, designing, implementation and impact assessment. (iii)To take up necessary steps/programs to institutionalize gender in the organization. (iv)To take up gender responsive projects and program.

Toymu feel and experienced that girls and women are negligence portion in the society. Women have very little opportunity to take part in socio-economic development programs. Therefore;

Toymu gives high priority to girls and women in staff recruitment process, beneficiaries selection and participation of development programs. In job circulation and recruitment process, Toymu consideration of minimum required educational qualification and relevant experience for women. Toymu give preference to women in recruitment and presently among total 297 nos. of staffs and volunteers 69% are women. For staff field distribution at field level, female staffs are set up at comparatively safe and secured location where they could move and communicate easily. At least 40% women staffs and beneficiaries ensured in any training/workshops. Toymu also provide maternity leave as per government policy and others consideration for female staffs. We possess zero tolerance for any violence against women staffs.

Presently, we have been implementing three (3) projects in seven upazilas of Bandarban hill district where girls and women are specially focussed. In the past, we also had implemented women related different programs and activities in partnership with local national & international development agencies.

COMMUNITY COVERAGE

Toymu has coverage at least twelve (12) communities including Bengali People as organizational staffs and/or volunteers as well as programs' beneficiaries. Presently, in our organization most of staffs and volunteers are belongs to Marma community and Bengali (40%). Others are from Tripura, Bawm, Mro, Tanchangya, Khumi, Kheyang, Chakma, Chak, Lusai, Rakhine and Pankho communities.
