### Background

In 1994, some social-minded students took the initiative to form an organization in response to the issues of extreme poverty, low literacy rate, social and political conflict, eroding cultural identity, and high incidence of human rights violations among the indigenous peoples in the Chittagong Hill Tracts of Bangladesh.

Toymu, a Tripura word meaning 'never ending', was officially registered as a non-government and non-political voluntary development organization in the Social Service Department of Bangladesh in 1996 and in the NGO Affairs Bureau in 1998.

The organization aims to develop the socio-economic conditions of the most vulnerable and underprivileged people in the Hill Tracts. Through the years, Toymu has strived to build the capacities of the communities to manage and implement projects in a sustainable manner, have a voice in decision making, and dignity as a people. This has been achieved in partnership with local, national, and international agencies as well as government institutions.

Despite being founded by Tripura, the organization is practicing an inclusive staffing policy. The EXECOM and the staff are composed of individuals from different tribes and different backgrounds. Such a policy enabled the organization to spread its reach and provide opportunities to the different tribes in the locality.

### **Management:**

Toymu operates through a General Body (policy makers) and Executive Committee (decision-makers).

**General Body** consists of 17 members (women -8). The GB at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) makes organizational policies, approves annual budget/ project budget and audit, appoints auditors and elects.

### **Executive Committee**

Executive Committee consists of seven members (women-03). The EC members have a stake in the administrative and financial affairs, besides policymaking and strategic management, which ensures financial transparency and accountability of the organization. The EC approves and reviews the projects and annual plan. The Board guides the Executive Director for smooth and proper implementation of projects. There is also an advisory board to extend their assistance for smooth function of the organization activities.

Executive Director is the head of the organization and exercises authority over all works and activities. The ED maintains necessary liaison with different donors, Govt. Officials, Civil Society and others for development of the organization. The ED is accountable and reportable to the EC.

### **Financial Management:**

Toymu has a Financial Management Policy that governs transparency and accountability in managing program and project funds. It is consistent with the standard accounting rules and principles and compliant with statutory and donor requirements (Stated elsewhere in the document)

### Organizational future plan and implementation Strategies

In the light of the recent developments in the community and in the growing organization, Toymu underwent an Organizational Development Assessment in 2007. The strategic planning process that followed enabled the organization to understand the changes in the last five years while equipping them to meet new challenges in the light of a new strategy. This resulted to a document that provided the overall direction of the organization in the next three to five years focusing on the following areas:

### **Current Project**

### **Toydang Hostel.**

Toydang Hostel managed by Toymu has been operating since 2000 till date. The hostel is currently being run with the contribution of Toymu, parents and benefactors. The hostel provides facilities to the students from remote areas especially Mro, Tripura, Tanchagya students. Considering the parents' poverty, limited knowledge to use available resources and others, project created provisions of educational materials, food and health care support for admitted students. Currently, 21 boys and 16 girls are studying in this hostel from class six to class ten, total 37 boys and girls are studying.

The Hostel location at Pan Bazar, Alikadom Upazila of Bandarban Hill Disrtrict.

### General Objective

:- To improve the present undesirable situation of the target children providing education, health and recreational facilities under this project.

### Specific Objectives

- :- (1) To provide educational and teaching materials among the tribal students
- (2) To motivate the parents regarding the importance of education.
- (3) To build up school going habit amongst the non school going children.
- (4) To build awareness amongst the trial people.

  - (1) Provision created for education: Education provision has created for the disadvantaged students of the areas.

- (3) Provide educational materials, food and health care: Considering the parents' poverty, limited knowledge to use available resources and others, project created provisions of educational materials, food and health care support for admitted students.
- (4) Arrange guardian meeting for awareness building- To raise awareness to quality education among the guardian, project organizing annual guardian meeting regularly.
- (5) Organize annual culture and sports: To inspire to quality of education and as a part of recreation, project had been organizing annual culture and sports program for the students.

To reduce the incidence of water born disease in the target communities thereby improving the public health condition of the rural poor in CHT.

### **Project Achievements**

1. Provided beneficiaries with primary health care training which resulted to women improve sanitation practices like the

proper use of toilet and disposal of garbage among others.

- 2. Clean water supply established in two villages that lessen the time of women in fetching water and the reduction of occurrence of diarrhea and other water born diseases.
- 3. Provided financial support to 150 families to procure pit latrine including its installation that resulted to improve community sanitation.

### Findings:

- Due to newly experience in school registration process, SMC faced many difficulties in dealing with other concern authorities,
- Lack of proper communication and transportation in remote areas where only walking is applicable, difficult to carry out all materials to the schools,
- Community expected highly about school registration completion as soon by the govt.,
- Community concern about high education accessibilities specially after completion class five from the respective schools,
- In continuation children education opportunity, community urge for establishment of hostel program in appropriate place.
- Program could not deliver as plan and schedule due to Union Council's chairmen and members were busy with their personal and official duty.
- Project activities expansion in the new area to meet and response to the demands of community people.

### Learning:

- SMCs and community's ensured ownership in school program,
- Parents understood their significance role in continuing their support and children schooling.
- Better relationship in coping with the faced challenges through working with the community people
- SMC, MG and PTA are now able to easily make decision on education as they are motivated,
- Communities inspired to enroll their children to education
- Communities mobilized to ensure children's regular attendance, regular teaching, and sustainability school registration processes.
- Reaching out the hard-to-reach communities are the big challenge for the project.
- The project is covering diverse ethnicity groups with different local languages which hinder the effectiveness of the project.
- Trainings should be conducted by highly qualified facilitator to raise awareness on the issues of human rights and ward/local area should be given preference as venue due to the critical geographical context.
- Develop training modules by giving importance on the selection of facilitation method, relevant topic inclusion, level of audience etc. particularly for CHT.

#### **Conclusion:**

Toymu has been implementing different activities for development of socio-economic condition in Bandarban Hill district since 1994. AKS has been trying her best to address the priorities as

much as possible through implementing various projects. Toymu is always active to contribute in the areas of poverty reduction, woman rights and ecological conservation.

Since last two decades, Toymu has been making significant contribution for the development of CHT people in the field of community empowerment, economic development, education (Formal and Nonformal), gender equality & women development, child development, health and nutrition, water & sanitation, forest and environment, agriculture, human rights and good governance.
